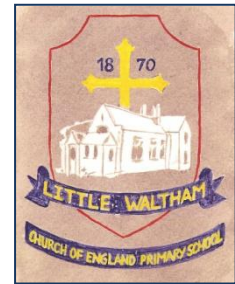

### **Free School Meals**

Please apply for these if you are eligible – it makes a substantial difference to the allocation of our catering budget from the Local Authority.

*'To increase your Pupil Premium allocation, as many parents as possible should register for Free School Meals by next January's census. We've gathered good practice from schools on how you can encourage more parents to do this.*

*You may also want to make parents aware of updated information on the [DirectGov website](#) about the process of registering for Free School Meals and its link to the Pupil Premium.*

*Your local authority will be able to tell you the last date by which applications should be submitted to ensure eligibility is confirmed in good time for the 19 January census day.'*

*The last date for applications is 18<sup>th</sup> January.*

You can now order lunches just **ONE** week in advance, this guarantees your choice. Ordering a lunch for your child on the day may mean that your child does not get their choice.
